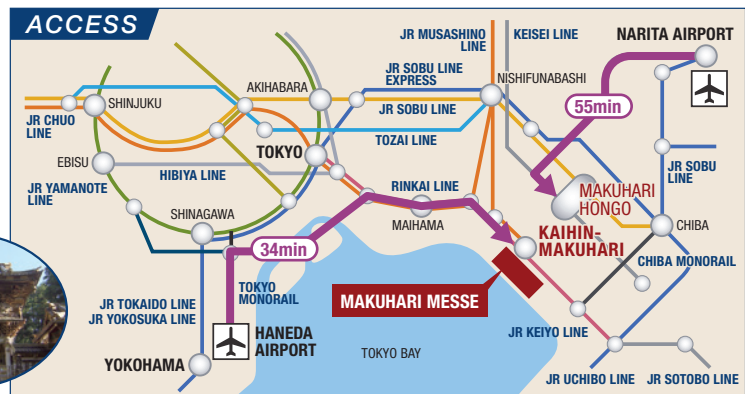

3. Belong to a World Psychiatric Association member society
 (Note: Up to a maximum of two applicants from each society)

The Japanese Society of Psychiatry and Neurology (JSPN) was founded in 1902, and celebrated its 100th anniversary by hosting the Yokohama World Congress of Psychiatry in 2002. As Japan's foremost organization for psychiatrists, it has 16,000 members, publishes the monthly journal, *Psychiatria et Neurologia Japonica* in Japanese, and the journal, *Psychiatry and Clinical Neurosciences*, in English. In recent years, the annual meetings of JSPN have attracted 6,000-7,000 participants (including 100-200 colleagues from overseas), in which English is the official language in at least one track of the programs. JSPN is pursuing more international collaboration through the World Psychiatric Association (WPA), the Asian Federation of Psychiatric Associations (AFPA) and other international organizations. The JSPN invites 12 early-career psychiatrists from all over the world to every annual meeting and grants each of them a JSPN Fellowship Award.

About the Journal

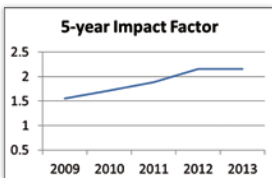
